

### The Vicar Writes:



April Fool's Day is the traditional way to begin this month. In medieval times the fool (or jester) was not just there for amusement. He had an influential role in the court, because he could speak the truth in ways others couldn't. As Christians we are also called to be fools; Paul described himself as a 'fool for Christ' (1 Corinthians 4:10). In what ways is this an appropriate description

of a Christian? In his letter Paul expands on this theme.

#### A foolish message:

'For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.' (1 Cor 1:18). The heart of the Gospel does not focus on clever ideas, but on the Cross of Jesus Christ. This message of foolishness and weakness is both God's wisdom and power for our lives.

#### A foolish community:

'But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong.' (1:27). The church in Corinth consisted of slaves, rather than the rich and successful. God calls the weak and vulnerable to follow Him, in order to shame those who think they don't need God.

#### A foolish ministry:

'My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, so that your faith might not rest on human wisdom, but on God's power.' (2:4,5). Paul's ministry didn't rest on human wisdom, but on the power of the Holy Spirit. For us, this power is often displayed when we are at our weakest.

### Patronage of St. Saviour's

We have recently received confirmation from the Diocesan Registrar that Linda Shelmerdine has been appointed by +Mark, Bishop of Chester as one of the Patrons of the Parish Church of St. Saviour, Great Moor.



St. Saviour's has 4 patrons in all: Canon Elaine Chegwin-Hall, incumbent of St. George's, Stockport (as we once were a daughter church before we became a parish in our own right in 1934). Ron Hudson and Cathy Finney are also patrons, and Linda's appointment comes as a result of the death of the late Lewys Mills. Following the death of a patron, those remaining nominate a successor who is duly appointed by the Diocesan Bishop.

Church patronage has a long history in the life of the Church of England, carried over from the pre-Reformation church. Every parish will have one or more patrons. The appointment is usually for life.

Nowadays, the patron's prime role and responsibility is one of a duty of care to the place of which they are patron. They can act as wise external advocates for the parish especially at times of change. When a vacancy occurs, once the new priest has been appointed by the Bishop, patrons present the priest to the parishioners, as Cathy did when Rev. Jess Piper was installed at St. Saviour's.

Linda said: "I was delighted and proud when my appointment was confirmed. It's such an honour, and a privilege to hold this position in the church that's been in my heart since my childhood."

things. If you feel that you can help and spare a couple of hours, your time will be greatly appreciated.





Our Vicar's Last Sunday







### All in the month of April

It was:

300 years ago, on 7th April 1724 that the German composer Johann Sebastian Bach's St John Passion was performed for the first time, at a church in Leipzig.

75 years ago, on 7th April 1949 that the Rodgers and Hammerstein musical South Pacific was opened in Broadway.

60 years ago, on 15th April 1964 that twelve men convicted of carrying out the Great Train Robbery in England in August of 1963 were jailed for a total of 307 years. They were given some of the longest sentences in British criminal history.

50 years ago, on 6th April 1974 that the Swedish pop group ABBA won the Eurovision Song Contest with their song Waterloo. It was the first time that Sweden won the contest. ABBA went on to be one of the most successful groups in music history.

30 years ago, on 6th April 1994 that the Rwandan genocide began, when a plane carrying Rwandan president Juvenal Habyarimana and Burundian president Cyprien Ntaryamira was shot down by extremists. Civil war broke out the following day, and between 500,000 and one million people were massacred during the next 100 days.

Also 30 years ago, on 26th April 1994 that the first postapartheid multiracial elections were held in South Africa, with 18 million blacks eligible to vote for the first time. Nelson Mandela was elected president and took office on 10th May.

20 years ago, on 1st April 2004 that Google launched its free email service, Gmail.
